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SMART CASUAL & WHY IT'S A DON'T

Smart Casual is a style halfway between formal and casual. Therefore, it is neither an elegant look with a jacket and necktie, nor an overly sporty outfit with sneakers, t-shirt and jeans. Smart Casual stands for "simple, but elegant".

- Business Attire** is a step up from Business Casual. Highly recommend Jackets and Neckties.
- Semiformal/Cocktail:** A more relaxed look than what's required at a formal, black-tie event. Wear something nice, no need to purchase an evening gown or rent a tux. Instead wear a cocktail dress, dressy jumpsuits, rompers, & separates, or a suit or tailored pieces. This includes a shirt, chinos or slacks, a sports jacket or blazer, and dress shoes.
- Military Uniform:** those wishing to wear military uniform (ASU/Class A/Mess Dress) are authorized to do so, yet not required.

- Casual Civilian:** Safe, decent, neat, and clean. Civilian clothing will be worn in good taste, conservative, and set an example of neatness with your appearance.
- Sports Team Theme:** Wear a jersey, shirt, or other attire to show us who you root for.
