On behalf of the WINGA Board of Directors, I wish everyone in our WINGA family a healthy and safe New Year. This issue of the *Communicator* is loaded with important information about what WINGA is doing to serve our state membership. Of immediate interest is registration information for the 2022 WINGA/WNGEA/RAVA State Conference on 22-24 April in Green Bay hosted by the 64<sup>th</sup> Troop Command. This will be the second year we are joined by the Red Arrow Veterans Association (RAVA) for our Joint State Conference. The Wisconsin National Guard State Conference is a great venue to hear presentations from our military leaders, participate in Professional Development sessions, and network with fellow Guard members and our corporate partners.

This is the time of year to consider joining or renewing your membership in WINGA and NGAUS. New this year is the Digital Active Life Membership program which is half the cost of a traditional life membership. This is a trial program and only available for the next four years. This new membership program provides all of the regular benefits of life membership except the National Guard magazine and the Communicator newsletter are sent to

you digitally rather than a paper copy and the member will not receive a steel membership card. Including the WINGA financial incentive, Company Grade Officers can become life members of WINGA and NGAUS for \$330 and Field Grade Officers for \$455. You can pay your dues at [www.winga.org](http://www.winga.org) by clicking the "Join/Renew" tab.

WINGA and NGAUS are your professional associations who lobby for you in Madison and Washington. NGAUS is an "Association of Associations", meaning NGAUS represents all 54 state and territory National Guard Associations. Lobbying involves much more than persuading legislators to support certain bills. It includes researching and analyzing legislation and/or regulatory proposals; monitoring and reporting on developments; and then educating not only government officials, but also employees and corporate officers, as to the implications of new or enhanced legislative action. According to the National Institute on Lobbying and Ethics, "What most lay people regard as lobbying – the actual communication with legislators – represents the smallest portion of a lobbyist's time; a far greater portion is devoted to the other aspects of preparation, information, and communications." Adding your voice with others who desire similar legislative initiatives is the way to get action. Believe it or not, numbers count! Your membership is needed to ensure your voice is heard in Madison and D.C. Both WINGA and NGAUS have been critical in securing the many benefits you currently enjoy. Make sure you are having an influence by keeping your membership current. Your membership is a tremendous value for what you and your family receive in return.

**PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION DUES FOR MEMBERSHIP YEAR 2022**

**Life Membership Dues:** NGAUS is offering a new Digital Active Life Membership for only \$500; officers must also become WINGA life members at a cost of \$80. WINGA is offering an incentive of \$250 for company grade officers and \$125 incentive for field grade officers. **This new option means that company grade officers can become active life members of NGAUS & WINGA for only \$330 while the cost to field grade officers would be \$455.** The only differences in the digital life membership vs the traditional life membership is members receive a digital copy of the National Guard Magazine and WINGA newsletter rather than a printed copy and do not receive a steel membership card. Regular NGAUS life membership dues cost \$1,000 so this is a 50% savings. Active life members are members forever—even after they retire—so there is no additional payment to become a retired life member.

**Updated Payment Options on the WINGA Website—www.winga.org.** The WINGA website has been updated so that members can pay for annual membership, digital active life membership or retired life membership directly on the WINGA website using PayPal, credit or debit. Drop down menus will display the correct dollar amount for each rank within each type of membership.

Our membership campaign runs from 1 November 2021 to 28 September 2022. Commands achieving 100% membership by the 29 March 2022 deadline will be eligible for the 5% Early Bird rebate. Dues may be paid in any of the following ways:

### WINGA OFFICER NOMINATIONS SOUGHT

The Nominations Committee is seeking individuals interested in running for the WINGA offices of President, Vice President Army, Vice President Air, Secretary, and Treasurer. The term of office is for two years—2022-2024.

The Nominations Committee provides the names of eligible candidates, which are to be included on the official ballot not later than **1 February**. Elections will be conducted at the annual business meeting in Green Bay on Saturday **23 April**. Members in attendance will cast their ballots. Absentee ballots must be requested in writing, via email or letter, NLT **21 February**; absentee ballots must be returned to the WINGA Office NLT **14 April**.

The duties of these officer positions are:

**President**—presides at all WINGA conferences and all meetings of the Board of Directors. Chairs the Executive Committee and appoints all standing and special committees of WINGA. Exercises all executive powers to carry out WINGA policies and signs all contracts, deeds, or legal obligations in the name of the Assn.

**Vice President Army**—In the alternate service of the President will be designated as Executive Vice President and performs the duties of the President during the absence of the President and in the event of death, resignation, or removal from office. Serves as the Chair of the Finance Committee and responsible for the budget processes and for coordinating all committee activities.

**Vice President Air**—In the alternate service of the President will be designated as Executive Vice President and performs the duties of the President during the absence of the President and in the event of death, resignation, or removal from office. Responsible for the administration of the Awards Program.

**Secretary**—is the recording officer of the organization responsible for WINGA records and a member of the Executive Committee.

**Treasurer**—receives, collects, and disburses all funds of the Assn. Keeps regular accounts of all sums received and disbursed, and shall notify all members in arrears. Makes an annual report of the financial status.

NGB has approved a limited number of company grade officers/enlisted to attend professional development (PD) in a paid status. Selection of personnel will be determined by the chain of command. Individuals in a paid status must attend all PD sessions / official functions.

**Registration:** Online conference registration <https://wngea.org/wngea-conf-reg/>. Through 1 April, the Early Bird Registration fee is \$25 per person and \$34 per person for the Saturday evening banquet. Effective 2 April, the registration fee will increase to \$35 per person and the Saturday evening banquet charge will increase to \$37 per person. There is no charge for the icebreaker nor for any meeting/breakfast/luncheons. If you prefer to mail in your registration, mail the registration form (see insert) and your check to the 64th Troop Command (54th CST), ATTN: CPT Justin Hofmann, 6001 Manufacturers Dr Madison, WI 53704. There is also a link on the WINGA website to the conference registration site.

You can complete your room reservation online at the same time you complete your online conference registration. If you prefer to contact the hotel directly, you must ask for a room in the Wisconsin National Guard Association room block to receive the reduced rate; room block deadline is **15 April**. Room rate is \$96 plus state/local taxes of \$14.88, for a total of \$110.88. Rooms include comp Wi-Fi, fitness center, swimming pool, complimentary parking, casino, mini-fridge, hair dryer. There will also be a link on the WINGA website that will take you directly to the hotel reservation site.

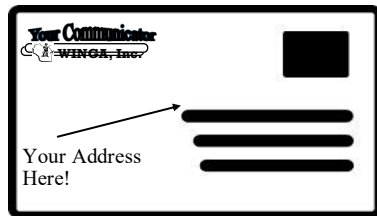
